# THE CENTENNIAL "ULTIMATE" HOMECOMING

What better place to celebrate and, in keeping with tradition, than to have our **Friday, May 16th** Wine & Cheese Celebration event at the **Kansas City Museum?** 

The celebration will start at 4 p.m. and end at 8 p.m. after everyone has visited with former classmates and friends and reminisced about everything from sledding down the hill by the museum to Cliff Drive rides and hayrides and proms.

You will arrive at 4 p.m. and enter at the side entrance of the Museum where you will be greeted by a board member with a name tag. The Courtyard will be an inviting place to mingle as you meet old friends. There will be a cash bar and tables for conversation. The Carriage House will have a cash bar as well, serving wine, beer, soft drinks and bottled water, along with various kinds of cheese, crackers and light appetizers. No food or drinks are allowed in the Museum. A large signature board will be ready for you to sign to document your presence at this milestone occasion and will be permanently stationed in our alumni room.

A tour of the Museum will be conducted in groups to inform us as to the current plans and ongoing renovations to this fabulous historic building. We ask that you participate as they have been so accommodating with our celebration.

The former Planetarium will be the Storyatorium and will be available to listen to or tell some fun and historical facts about Northeast.

Carriage rides will be available on a "pay" basis and will leave from the front of the Museum with a choice of two routes to be taken through the mansion area and those areas stored in our memories forever.

Pictures will be taken of the evening and both Friday's and Saturday's events will be live-streamed for those who can only be with us from afar.

<u>Saturday, May 17 from 9 a.m-6 p.m.</u> The Centennial Festival of fun begins for the Alumni and Northeast Community. Games, entertainment, music, school participation, bounce houses, a sidewalk chalk art contest and much more will be held on the field behind **Northeast**. We will have a Master of Ceremonies and announcers.

In the gym we will have a "connection" area set up by decades where alumni can visit, pay dues, purchase available yearbooks and logo items as well as a 100-year t-shirt designed by a student of NE in a contest sponsored by the alumni association. Tours of the school will be given by the ROTC cadets.
