

The Vikings' defense was exceptionally good and their running plays functioned well behind excellent blocking. In the five league games Northeast played, only seven points were scored against the Vikings—the best defensive record in the history of the school and of the interscholastic league.

Bob Pierce was quarterback. His long passes, weaving runs, and sterling defense won for him a position on the Inter-scholattic League All-Star Team. Several other Vikings were honored by having their names added to the All-Star list. These were:

Kenny Bounds, tackle with a combination of speed, weight, and ability. Kenny worked his way to the top.

Joe Hempfling, tackle. Joe's steady defensive and offensive work was invaluable to the team.

Richard Petrechko, guard. His defensive ability and his aggressiveness on the offense, put him among the all-stars.

Kenneth Olsen, center. "Snapper" was a threat both on the defensive and the offensive, opening up holes so the backs could get through was Kenny's job.

Following in the teps of their big brothers, the second team, coached by Mr. George Calvert, tied for the second team championship. Several members of this team will be valuable in the next championship drive.








