
Committee Chairmen will be selected by the President, and they in turn will select their committee members. Congratulations to the new officers. We anticipate another productive and successful year.

ORIGIN OF OUR SCHOOL SONG

During the first year's existence of the Northeast High School, Principal C. B. Reynolds proposed that the school have its own



song. After Professor Frank E. Chaffee had selected the simple, beautiful,
and popular air from Dr. A.W. Noll's
tune of "Naples", the pupils were requested to submit original and suitable
verses to fit this tune. From these poems were chosen the verses written by
Mrs. Ethel Mae Rush-Randall, whose
father, Professor Elmer E. Rush, was
then a member of the faculty. Miss
Clella Hobbs, '25, transposed the music
to conform to the wording. Bemis
Lester, '24, designed the copy of the music as we use it today.

Ethel May Rush-Randall was born in Kansas City, MO, May 24, 1896. She was graduated from Garfield school June, 1909. She was graduated from Northeast High School June, 1914.

She made thirty-two E's, and four G's in solids, and eight E's in non-solids, totaling forty points.

She helped to organize the "Alpha Literary Society", and was its president during the first year. She helped to organize the German Club, and became its president. She was one of the editors of the "Nor'easter." She won a gold medal for poem in the "Lit" contest. She was secretary of the Senior Class and gave the oration at commencement. She was graduated at Junior College with the highest honors in 1916, and was elected a Phi Beta Kappa at Kansas University.

Ethel Mae Rush-Randall wrote our school song!

COACH MARKEY INTO CMSU ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

E. A. Markey, Northeast football coach from the mid-thirties to mid-fifties, was inducted into the Central Missouri State University Athletic Hall of Fame on February 11, 1995. Coach Markey, and the late Jim Hoverder, Class of '48, a 1993 inductee, now represent our alma mater in the Hall of Fame. "Coach" played Mules football and basketball at Warrensburg four years from 1917-21, his freshman and sophomore years under Forrest C. Allen before

"Phog" went on to a legendary career as basketball coach at Kansas University. When Coach Markey arrived as football coach at Northeast in 1937, he had already established a successful career in the '20's and '30's at Marshall, Jefferson City and Nevada. His greatest years were at Northeast where the undefeated and untied 1948 team scored 169 points while allowing nine opponents a total of two touchdowns. Jan Markey Walker, Class of '59, accepted the award for her father. In moving remarks, she said, "If Dad were here, I know he would be smiling and graciously accepting-I know that he is watching from somewhere." Northeast grads in attendance at the ceremony included James Kirkpatrick, Class of '24. James Fetters. Class of '43. He is active in the North Kansas City Community Center, and he still swings a mighty mean tennis racket. The school is proud to have had you as a member of the faculty, and the Alumni Association is proud to have you as one of it's distinguished members.
