100 YEARS IS JUST THE BEGINNING

Northeast High School, located at 415 S. Van Brunt Boulevard, will be celebrating its 100th birthday anniversary of its competition in 2013.

On May 26th, 1911, the Northeast Improvement Association conferred, chatted, orated, talked, spoke, argued, discussed and finally, the meeting resulted in The Plan for a new school. The committee was appointed and R.A. Long and Colonel R. W. Fleming of that committee spoke with the school board in the hope of getting a high school in the Northeast section.

The purchase of the land on November 2nd, 1911 had previously been part of the parks and boulevard systems. The plot of land measured 600' by 249' and was ultimately purchased for \$42,500. The plans were approved in July of 1912

Construction began on October 4th, 1912. A petition was formed in May of 1913 to name the school, after the then Superintendant of Schools, James M. Greenwood. That plan was vetoed and instead the school was "christened" Northeast High School. They voted then to have a picture of the superintendent hung in the library and if there were funds available, commission a bust. Apparently the funds never come forth.

The construction of Northeast took 19 months to complete, due to a bricklayers union 150 man walkout. Conflicts continued, moving the opening day into May of 1914. The election of principals, Charles B. Reynolds and VP Nowlin took place on March 18th 1913, which officially recognized the founding date of Northeast as a high school. A letter was sent home on April 21, 1913 to begin enrollment for the 1913-1914 school year. The 687 students of the first graduating class attended Central High in the afternoons while Northeast completed construction. The first year, NE students only attended classes in the new school from May 4, 1914 to June 12, 1914, just in time for graduation!

Since the Purple and White Newsletter began its distribution, we have highlighted many alumni memories of the school, neighborhood and surrounding stores that played a big part of our formative years. The Alumni Room at Northeast is rich in memorabilia of our schools history! Graduates have donated class rings, literary jackets, pins, letter jackets, yearbooks, trophics, megaphones, dance cards (from the early years), photographs, newspaper articles of our notables, books that have been authored by our alumni, silverware, doorknobs and even furniture as newer items were purchased for the school! We have a wealth of memories located in the NE Alumni Room. Stop by the school the next time you are in the area (or in town) and see the changes to our building over the last 100 years!

This year the voting procedures have changed and I am posting them in this newsletter as well as on the website. The voting procedures will be adhered to with no exceptions made.

VOTING PROCEDURES

All Active/Lifetime members may vote at the general meeting. Absentee voters may receive a ballot from the Secretary of the Association by mailing your request for a ballot to P. O. Box 1264, Blue Springs, MO 64013. To insure ample time to receive your request, confirm your eligibility, return your ballot, and then have time to receive and record your ballot, all requests for ballots must be presented two weeks prior to the meeting and received by the Secretary prior to the meeting. You may wish to vote by proxy by mailing to the address given above to receive an authorized form to indicate your proxy. Receiving the authorized form will assure that you have been verified to be eligible to vote. Of course, only the name of the proxy, indicated on the returned authorized form, will be eligible to vote at the meeting. In order to receive your request for the authorized form, verify your eligibility, send it back to you, and authorize your proxy to vote; request for the authorized proxy form must also be presented in writing two weeks prior to the meeting and received by the Secretary prior to the meeting. Individual acting as proxy must be in attendance.

This election is a great opportunity for you to vote and demonstrate your support for your alumni candidates of choice. We hope that all eligible voters will participate in determining the selection of the Board of Directors up for election. The business meeting is also an opportunity to visit with classmates. We hope you will plan to attend this important meeting.

Once again, it has been a wonderful experience for me to serve as your President. The opportunity to work with such a dedicated, , hard working Board of Directors made it easy for me to perform my duties. Your support of our efforts is appreciated and the students are happier knowing they are supported by a strong Alumni Association.

Our goal is to help the student feel comfortable with the process so that we can get to know them. They all come into the interview pervous about what we will ask and how we will "judge" them. But when they exit the interview, we feel that we have done our job if they leave feeling like they will soon be one of "us"...a Northeast Alumni!

We would cruise the entire strip. The strip being Independence Avenue, all the way from Mug's Up Root Beer, Allen's Drive In, Smaks and Di-Maggio's. Sometimes we would play pool at the Pool Hall at St. John and Jackson. We never got tired of it but from time to time, we would get into some mischief.

One Friday evening we decided to play a joke on a very popular girl from church and Northeast. We decided to cover her small front yard with as many For Sale signs as we could find (40 to 50), then cover the yard, house, trees and bushes with, you guessed it, toilet paper. Oh, it was a beautiful thing!

We kept driving around and around the block looking at our handy work, each time we would laugh louder as we rounded the corner. The neighbors eventually called the police, and within an hour, the police caught up with us at non other than, DiMaggio's. It wasn't such great Police work, 9 guys stuffed into a 1953 Dodge with a roll of toilet paper around the antenna. We spent the next weekend putting back all the signs and cleaning up the yard. Those were the best of times. Most of the guys still live in and around the greater KC area. I moved several years ago to Maine. Some of us keep in touch. I'm retired and have a chance to day-dream about the memories I left behind. All my life I wanted to be an artist but never did, but here is a drawing I did as a logo for the Northeast Vikings.



Assertion: Coach Reaves Peters attended Northeast High School as a student. Fact: Coach Peters graduated from a college in Warrensburg, Missouri, class of 1913. (Northeast did not open until the spring of 1914.) The college was named Normal Number 2 during his time there, later named Central Missouri State Teachers College, later still Central Missouri State College, even later Central Missouri State University, and more recently University of Central Missouri.
