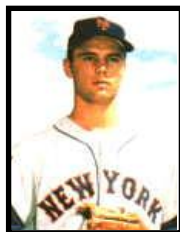


JAMES BETHKE

Class of 1992



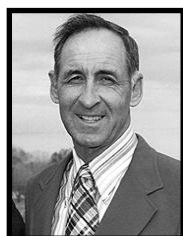

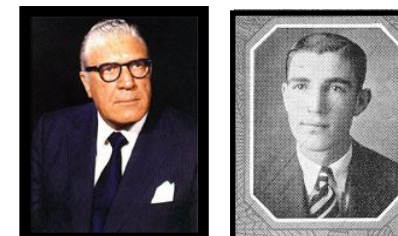


ERIC HAWKINS

Prolific American mystery writer. Created the Mr. & Mrs. North mysteries. Later his books were made into a TV series

CHARLES RICHARD LONG
Class of 1941



President Truman presented the Congressional Medal of Honor posthumously to Charles Long. While fighting in Korea, Charles acted to allow his unit to escape annihilation by calling for explosive fire to take out the enemy. He continued to engage the enemy in the same area, to insure that his unit would escape and survive.

Class of 1925



Architect, Civic & Business Leader President of Colgate Palmolive. Designed Cape Canaveral, Edwards Air Force Base, Television City, Spacecraft Center in Houston. Decorated by France /Britain.

JAMES J LYNN
Class of 1914



Youthful prodigy that built a business empire through 3 insurance operations, oil, railroading, lumber and banking. Practiced law while in high school

Admin. & Coach



Coach at Northeast for 29 years. Member of MO HS Football Coaches & CMSU Athletic Hall of Fame. Memorial scholarships in his name at NE & CMSU.

MAX H. MESNER
Late Thirties



RCA technician that was a key member of the team to develop color television. His cameras took first pictures of man on the moon.

Wrote with her husband " Let There Be Peace On Earth" Starred in 7 movies.

Class of 1937



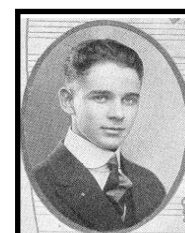
Researcher, educator and leader; made lasting contributions in the engineering profession in general and thermal power systems.
