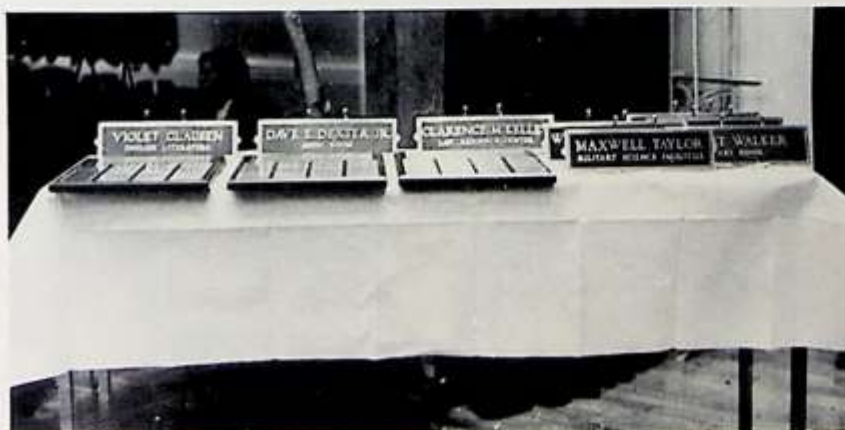

Ryun Middleton Running to the Top

Ryun Middleton, a senior on our varsity Cross Country team ran an outstanding race at the State Championships and finished second over-all. "I wouldn't say I really did great, but I am very pleased", said Ryun after returning to school. After a number of outstanding races during the regular season Ryun went on to the State Championships and placed second over-all in the 4A class. The previous week he won the Kansas City 4A sectionals and the week before that he won the District 8 Championships for the third straight year. Prior to that he won the Interscholastic League Championships for the 2nd year in a row and was voted the outstanding runner in the league. The Viking varsity team won the championship again for the 3rd year.

When asked what motivates Ryun to such performances he simply states, "the thrill of winning." He stated his successful running began in the 6th grade. By the time he was a seventh grader his career was in full swing, and he's been winning ever since.

Ryun's freshman year started off great by making all-conference in cross country and becoming the top freshman runner in the metro area. In track he was the top half miler and two miler in the conference. His personal record was lowered to an impressive 4:37. During the season Ryun competed mostly at the Varsity level.

As a sophomore runner he made all-conference for the second time. In the Fall he traveled to Los Angeles for the National AAU Cross Country Championships.



In the spring he won the Interscholastic League mile and 2 mile runs. He placed 2nd in the district and sectional meets in the mile run (1600 meters). He gained valuable experience by placing 7th in the state championships in Jeff City.

Beginning his Jr. year Ryun won the Interscholastic League Cross Country Championships at Blue Valley Park by defeating the returning champion, Darrel Green of Southwest. He won the District 8 Championship and qualified for the State meet by running well in the sectional. He was injured and didn't perform well at the state meet. The Kinney National Championships was the next big challenge for Ryun. He flew to Chicago and to Kenosha Wisconsin for this big race. He hadn't completely recovered from his illness, therefore he wasn't pleased with the outcome. Later that month he was selected as a first team all-metro runner by the Kansas City Star/Times. During the Spring he won the mile and two mile runs again and placed second in the 800 meter dash along side team mate Brad Grosstephan. He also competed in the state championships in the mile run. He ran a 4:20 mile and

placed 8th overall. Coach Ray Wade summed up Ryun's Junior year by saying, "All the previous experience and hard work has paid great dividends for Ryun. He deserves all the rewards he worked for."

During the summer of 1988, Ryun completed in an International Track and Field meet in Helsingborg, Sweden. He flew to Oslo, Norway and after a short visit he drove along the coast to Sweden. The track meet allowed him to test his running skills against teenagers from all over the world. On his final night in Sweden he attended a party given by the coaches and teachers from Prague, Czechoslovakia. The worst part of the entire trip was the long flight from KC to Oslo.

What's the key to Ryun's success? "I work hard at my training all year around. I refrain from drinking, smoking and drugs. I know I must have a healthy body. My training consists of 60-65 miles of running a week in any kind of weather...rain, sleet or snow. Basic exercises like push-ups, sit-ups and light weight training are also part of my training routine."

Besides competing in Cross Country and Track, Ryun also competes in the academic arena. His academic standards are high. His GPA is 3.5 in the college prep program. He will graduate in the top 10% of the senior class. At the present time he is deciding which university to attend. He has narrowed the choices to Northwest Missouri State, Southwest Missouri State and Arkansas. We all want to wish Ryun the best of success in athletics and academics as he follows his dreams into the future.

This course was organized with the help of Jeffrey Berman, Associate Dean of the UMKC Law School and Teresa Crater, an Attorney. It is designed to give the students a basic background in reading about a legal case and then making the preparations for a trial presentation. This involves a study of the text on trial presentation. Our course finishes with a Mock Trial of our own students as well as competition in the Metropolitan District Mock Trial competition.

In 1988 we "tried cases involving a 12 year old girl with AIDS, the right to attend school, and a case on the Hyatt Regency skywalk collapse. The first case was tried in Jackson County Circuit Court, and the second was held at the UMKC law School. This year we are going to "try" a sports injury law suit case.
