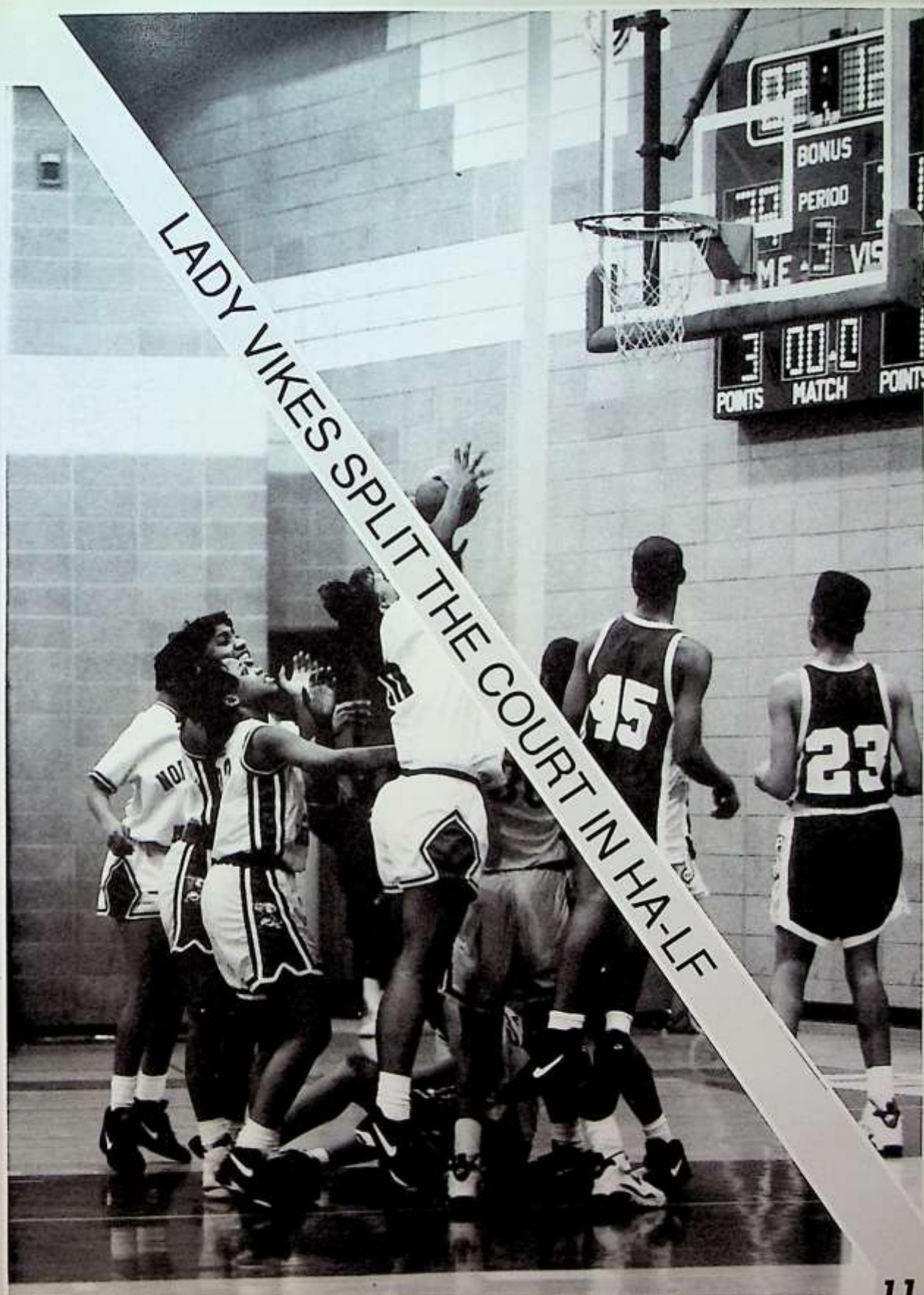

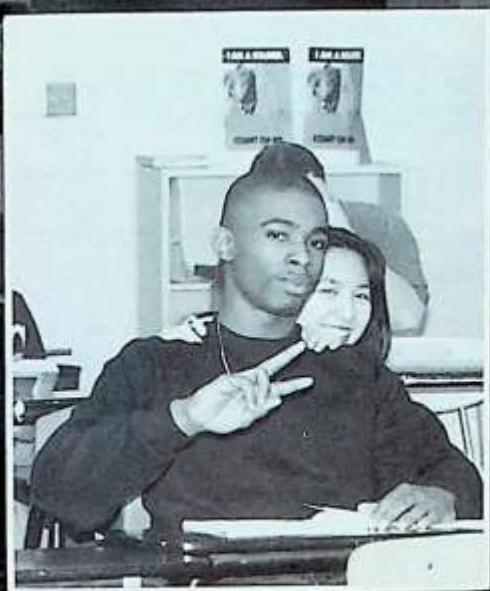




# *It's About* **VIKING** **SCHOLARS**
