Northeast



Jill Jackson Miller

Jill attended NEHS and 2 years of junior college in Kansas City before she moved to Hollywood to fulfill her dream of becoming an actress. She lived at the Studio Club, a well know home for aspiring actresses. Using the screen names of Jill Martin, Harley Wood and Harlene Wood she starred in several westerns in the 1930's and 1940's. She married Felix Jackson, a German writer and ended her acting career. After a divorce she collected her thoughts and talents and began writing children's stories. She met Sy Miller, a musician and composer for Warner Brothers. They married in 1949 and she began to write lyrics. Together they became Jan-Lee Music. She is best remembered for the song, *Let There Be Peace on Earth (and Let it Begin with Me)*. The song has been recorded by countless groups including the United Nations. It won the Valley Forge Freedom Foundation's "George Washington Medal" and an award from The National Council of Christians and Jews. Jill continued her work for peace until her passing in Hawaii in 1971



Mort Walker

Mort was drawing cartoons during his time at Northeast. He continued his education at Mizzou where they honored him years later with a Mort Walker Center and a large statue of Beetle Bailey outside of the complex. Every newspaper in the country has featured the comic of the work-shy army private known as Beetle Bailey. In 2000 Mort finished "*Mort Walker's Private Scrapbook*." The 50 years of Beetle marked its completion. He is ranked as the world's most prolific cartoonist along with stacks of prestigious honors and awards.



Mary Hamilton

Mary has spent over 50 years at Hallmark. Her teddy bears are created using watercolors. Hallmark has 3,000 pieces of her art work...and 1,200 are bears! She says she has always loved bears. And, her little teddy bears look cuddly and loved.



Ub Iwerks

Attended Northeast but unfortunately had to drop out when his dad disappeared. His father showed up years later....we can only imagine what type of cartoons would have graced the Nor'easter!! He is the true artist and creator of the Steamboat Willie mouse that all have come to love. Mickey Mouse! Walt Disney formed a company called Laugh-O-Gram films and Ub joined him. The business didn't work out and Disney ventured to California while Ub remained in KC. He produced *Looney Tunes* and *Porky Pig* among other animations. In 1940 he came back to Disney and spear-headed the 1946 *Song of the South* and later *Mary Poppins*. Ub helped develop a process for cell animation. He won Academy Awards in 1959 & 1965.

Notables



Clarence "Ducky" Nash
 was the voice of Donald Duck. He made a name for himself as an impressionist in the late 1920's. He later was dubbed "Whistling Clarence, the Adohr Bird Man" while he became the spokesperson for a local milk company. He happened to leave an information flyer with the receptionist and Walt remembered him from a previous film, *The Merry Makers*. Clarence was asked to make an informal audition. And, The rest is history. He voiced ALL of Donald's family and trained the future voices of Donald Duck & family.



R. Duane Seaman

The man behind the moon landing. In 1965, he was hired as a project supervisor for the Apollo Project at the NASA Johnson Space Center. In 1970 he organized AIM Financial Systems Group Inc. until retiring from President and CEO 28 years later. He currently resides in Independence and is listed in Marquis' Who's Who in America and Who's Who in Finance and Industry. And additional accolades too numerous to list. His last arrived this past January 2, 2014. He received the Who's Who in the Global Directory of Who's Who. We look forward to meeting him at our Spring Activities Week.



Goodman & Janice Ace

Both NEHS Vikings. Goodman was an actor and writer for the Perry Como Show among other works. Janice Sherwood Ace was a radio and television comedy writer, director and actress. They were a team for CBS radio show "The Easy Aces" (1930-1945). They were inducted into the Radio Hall of Fame in 1990. They were also in Who's Who of Comedy.



Clarence M. Kelley FBI

A NEHS graduate received his BA from the University of Kansas. On October 7, 1940 he entered the FBI as a special agent. He served in numerous states and positions. He received many awards for his outstanding service. June 27, 1973 he became the director of the FBI. After his retirement, he served as Chief of Police in Kansas City, MO. At that time, he also became active in many local clubs and associations.

Around 1910 the rapid growth and prosperity in the Northeast Community and the influence of many wealthy residents caused the Northeast Improvement Association to be established. Their first meeting at Garfield was May 25, 1911. A committee was elected to meet with the school board to establish priorities for improvements. Fred W. Fleming was a commander during the Spanish-American War, and was then Vice President of Kansas City Life Insurance. Another member was Edwin C. Meservey. He had recently been elected President of the Board of Civil Service and also served as City Counselor. This influential committee made an impression on the school board. The land for NEHS was purchased that November. The cost was \$42,500. This site had a frontage of 600 feet on the north and 249 on the east and west. The committee then needed to decide what kind of school would be built. The Assistant Superintendent traveled to the East Coast to investigate the latest trends in teaching. One was a "trade" school that would teach technical skills that would allow students to prepare for a job site. NEHS was not planning to offer skilled labor. Rather, a broad academic plan which would allow pupils to reach their potential. It was to be the best school west of the Mississippi River.

Charles A. Smith was the School Board's architect. At the time, Mr. Smith was one of the most prestigious architects in the city. He designed about 50 schools during his tenure. He also designed Kansas City Club on Baltimore, the Firestone Building on Grand, Fine Arts Building on the campus of UMKC, Unity Temple, Jenkins Music Co Building and Isis Theater. He predicted that the new Northeast building was going to surpass all existing Kansas City Schools. The school was to be built for a capacity of 1600. The first indoor swimming pool and a heating and cooling system that would be revolutionary. There would be gymnasiums with a running track. And, rest parlors for teachers as needed. This four story building would be completely concrete. The \$500,000 building was to be Grecian-Doric designed. It would be a fire-proof building and interior classrooms without windows would also have fresh air with the ventilation system. The school was also to serve the community at night for social events. The auditorium provided seating for 1500. The library was also a stand alone and could be accessed from the outside for the community to visit.
